


# Confirmation Success Rate:




- ➤ Nominees are successful between Military & Civilian
- > Success rate decreases at lower levels
- ➤ Civilians: Intent to Nominate concept

# Overall Time to Confirmation




- > Nominations are moving
- ➤ Most nominees confirmed between 1-3 months

# Average Time to Confirmation




➤ Military nominations move quicker

# Comparison by Position



- ➤ Consistency with Military
- > Civilians: Increasing time to confirm at lower levels
- > Expedited vs Routine

# Change Over Time




- > Military remains relatively unchanged
- ➤ Significant increase in last decade for Civilians



Confirmations are a "very healthy piece of civil-military relationship demonstrating the civilians are in control of the country, they have the right to challenge the military, they have the right to question them and determine whether they are fit to command. - Four Star Officer
